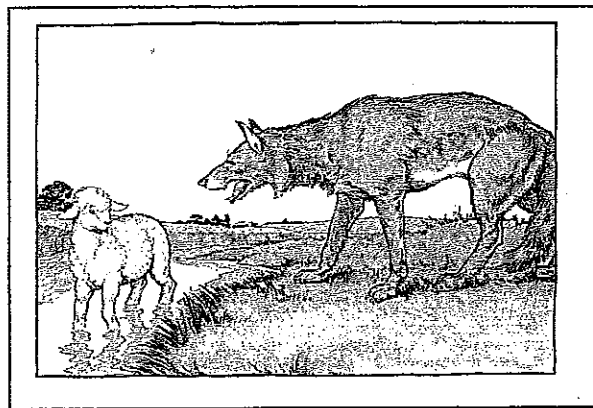


# Thinking in English #2

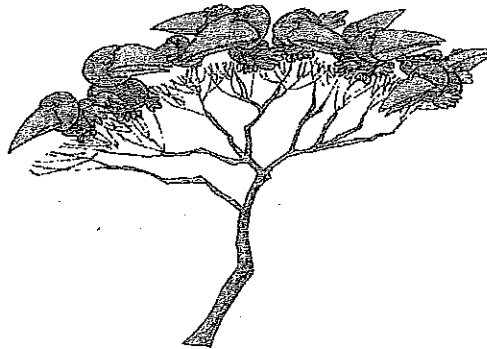

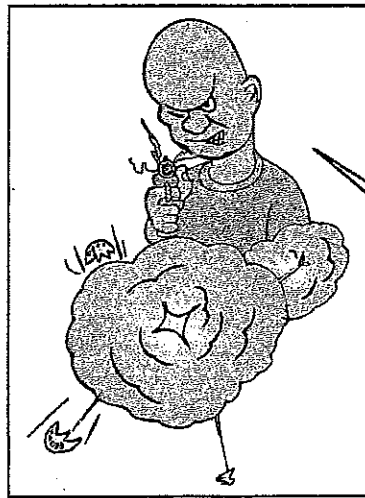
